a member of another Church or Religious Tradition, you are most welcome to join us for worship. The Liturgy is celebrated using a mix of English and Ukrainian. The readings from the Holy Gospel and Epistles, as well as homilies are in English.



33rd Sunday after Pentecost: Sunday of the Publican and the Pharisee Our Venerable and God-Bearing Father Anthony the Great

Troparion (1): Though the stone was sealed by the Judeans,* and soldiers guarded Your most pure body,* You arose, O Saviour, on the third day,* and gave life to the world.* And so the heavenly powers cried out to You, O Giver of Life:* Glory to Your resurrection, O Christ!* Glory to Your kingdom!* Glory to Your saving plan,* O only Lover of mankind.

Troparion (4) By your life you imitated the zealous Elias* and by following straight paths you emulated the Baptist, John.* O Father Anthony,* you peopled the desert and strengthened the world by your prayers;* intercede with Christ God to save our souls.

+Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit,

Kontakion (2): You rejected earthly worries* and finished your life in silence imitating the Baptist in every way* and so with him we honour you,* O Anthony, most venerable, first of the Fathers.

Now and for ever and ever. Amen.

Kontakion (Tone 3): Let us bring sighs of sorrow to the Lord as did the Publican* and approach the Master as sinners,* for He desires salvation for everyone.* He grants forgiveness to all who repent.* For as God, the One-who-is, co-eternal with the Father, He became flesh for us.

Prokimenon (Tone 8): Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon us, as we have hoped in You.

verse: Rejoice in the Lord, O you just; praise befits the righteous. (Psalm 32:22,1)

Prokeimenon, (7): Precious in the sight of the Lord* is the death of His venerable ones. (Ps 155:6)

Epistle: 2 Timothy 3:10-15: Timothy, my son, Now you have observed my teaching, my conduct, my



aim in life, my faith, my patience, my love, my steadfastness, my persecutions and suffering the things that happened to me in Antioch, Iconium, and Lystra. What persecutions I endured! Yet the Lord rescued me from all of them. Indeed, all who want to live a godly life in Christ Jesus will be persecuted. But wicked people and impostors will go from bad to worse, deceiving others and being deceived. But as

for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.

Alleluia (Tone 1): God gives me vindication, and has subdued people under me. **verse**: Blessed is the man who fears the Lord; he shall delight exceedingly in His commandments.

Gospel: *Luke 18:10-14:* The Lord said his parable, "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."

Communion Verse: Praise the Lord from the heavens;* praise Him in the highest.* (Ps 148:1) Alleluia (3x).

Pope's Morning Homily: The Lord Is Waiting for Us to Open Our Hearts

During Mass at Casa Santa Marta, Francis Reflects on What 'Love' Means Even if we can't count our sins, God is waiting for us to open the doors of our hearts to Him. Even if we don't feel we deserve it yet, He wishes to embrace us as we are.

Pope Francis stressed this during his daily morning Mass at Casa Santa Marta, as he drew inspiration from John's Gospel reading and reflected on various meanings of the word 'love,' reported Vatican Radio.

"This word 'love' is a word that is used so many times and when we use it we don't know exactly what it means. What is love? Sometimes we can think of the love in the soap operas, but that doesn't appear to be love. Or else love can seem like having a crush on a person, but then it fades away. Where does true love come from? Whoever loves has been created by God because God is love. Don't say: 'Every love is God,' No, God is love." The Apostle John, the Pope stressed, underscores how God loves us first, without limits, and there are many examples of this in the Gospel, including the parable of the prodigal son and the multiplication of the loaves of bread by Jesus. Not all love, Francis warned, comes from God, but He is the true love. He also directed those gathered to remember the two most important commandments for a Christian, namely loving God and our neighbor. "When we have something on our mind and we want to ask God to forgive us, it's He who is waiting for us – to forgive us," Francis said.

The Pontiff also asserted that this Jubilee Year of Mercy, to some extent, is also about us realizing that the Lord is waiting for us, each one of us.

"Why?" he asked, "To embrace us. Nothing more. To say to us: son, daughter, I love you. I let my Son be crucified for you: this is the price of my love, this is the gift of my love."

Francis continued, stressing, "The Lord is waiting for me, the Lord wants me to open the door of my heart" and that we are to realize God waits for us as we are now, not just as we are to be.

"We must go to the Lord and say: 'You know Lord how much I love you.' Or, if you don't feel able to say it in that way: 'You know Lord that I would like to love you but I am such a bad sinner,' Francis said. Pope Francis concluded, stressing that God then will do the same for his people as the father in the prodigal son: "He won't let you finish your speech and with an embrace will silence you. The embrace of God's love.
