Therefore, thank you to all in the Eparchy of New Westminister who generously donated to Catholic Missions In Canada in your recent Collection. A total of \$1,865 was collected. This is a great help in our mission to help the Catholic faith continue across the country in what are, sometimes, difficult conditions. I remember well visiting you and touring some of your parishes. I valued our discussions about the needs of your eparchy.

In 2018, CMIC is allocating over \$4,000,000, not to mention Ad Hoc grants which may be needed as the year progresses.
